He informed Members that the Director Overseeing the OAGF directed him to preside over the meeting. He expressed appreciation to God for keeping the Members healthy during the COVID-19 pandemic and hoped that Members would go home smiling at the end of the meeting.

After which the minutes were adopted following a motion moved by the Accountant General of Ondo State and seconded by the Accountant General of Osun State.

She stated that the Sub-Committee report was submitted rather late but promised that it would be presented at the next month's FAAC meeting. 8.1.15 to 8.1.19 Update on the Disbursement of the Bridging Finance to States and the FCT: The Director, Home Finance Department informed Members that the sixth and final tranche had been disbursed to the 36 States of the Federation. He added that the FCT was yet to access the funds due to incomplete documentation.
5.1.10 5.1.11 5.1.12 5.1.13	FCT representative reminded the Director HFD that FCT had submitted the required documentation but was yet to access the funds. The Director HFD promised to confirm submission of the documentation and liaise with the CBN to effect disbursement of the funds to the FCT.

- 5.1.18 forward a list of all such facilities. He added that, results may not have been seen but
- 5.1.19 that, the Chairman of FAAC was engaging CBN at the highest level to ensure that all
- 5.1.20 such discrepancies were addressed.
- 5.1.21 Update on the monitoring of Primary Health Care Projects in States.
- 5.1.22 The **Director**, **Home Finance Department** reported that the comprehensive report had
- 5.1.23 been submitted by the ALGON Secretariat and the FAAC Secretariat had circulated it
- 5.1.24 to Members. He implored Members to go through the report and give feedback so that
- 5.1.25 the FAAC Secretariat may arrange to undertake a verification of the report.
- 5.1.26 AG Akwa Ibom informed Members that the Project site in his Local Government
- 5.1.27 | Council had been overgrown by weed.
- 5.1.28 The Ag. Chairman advised Members to take up the issue as stakeholders and identify
- 5.1.29 the level of the work done in their various Local Government Councils and report back
- 5.1.30 at the next FAAC Meeting for onward upward submission for appropriate action.
- 5.1.31 | AG Delta stated that the status of the Project was stated in the report and payments had
- 5.1.32 been made via direct deductions from the Allocation of LGC's and insisted that all there
- 5.1.33 was left to be done was to compel the contractor to complete the project.
- 5.1.34 The Ag. Chairman responded that part of the funds had been released to the Contractor,
- 5.1.35 while the remainder was warehoused and insisted that additional confirmation from
- 5.1.36 | Members would help to resolve some of the issues.
- 5.1.37 | 8.1.21 to 8.1.23 Brief/Presentation to provide adequate information to Members
- 5.1.38 regarding the liquidation of Judgement Debts.
- 5.1.39 | **Director, HFD** informed Members that the brief had been circulated to Members
- 5.1.40 | though, the Director Legal Services was still indisposed and unavailable. However, the
- 5.1.41 deduction for the liquidation of the Judgment Debt was discussed extensively at the
- 5.1.42 | Plenary Session and suspended forthwith. He added that Members should study the brief
- 5.1.43 and voice their observations at the next FAAC meeting.

- 6.1.02 | The NNPC representative presented the report of the activities of the Corporation on
- 6.1.03 | Crude Oil and Gas Sales for the month of April, 2022 receipted in May, 2022. He
- 6.1.04 reported that 51,970.00 barrels of Crude Oil were exported in April, 2022 at a total sales
- 6.1.05 value of US\$5,618,777.98 ($\frac{1}{2}$ 204,527,540.45). Receipted in the month was the sum of
- 6.1.06 US\$5,399,450.00 (N2,118,474,207.50). There were other receipts for the month in the
- 6.1.07 sum of US\$10,203,200.39 (N4,003,225,673.02). The total sales value for the month was
- 6.1.08 +2,204,527,540.45 and it was lower by +3,522,505,273.82 when compared with the
- 6.1.09 previous month's sales value of $\pm 5,727,032,814.27$.

6.1.35 6.1.36 6.1.37 6.1.38 6.1.39	Director Funds sought clarification on the meaning Value Short Fall on the importation of Petroleum Motor Spirit (PMS) so that the explanation may help Members understand the outstanding balance of over one trillion naira. NNPC representative explained that crude oil was always valued in US dollars and the equivalent is remitted in naira. Regarding the meaning of Value Short Fall, he explained
6.1.40 6.1.41 6.1.42 6.1.43	that the cost of PMS is never recovered one hundred percent as a result of Government policy to maintain the retail price at less than the product cost to subsidize the product for the citizenry. AG Niger wondered why NNPC had over the years referred to subsidy as under
6.1.44 6.1.45 6.1.46	recovery and value short fall instead of sticking with one name for easy understanding and reference. He also sought to know why NNPC or its subsidiaries do not pay royalty at the point of lifting crude oil like all the other oil companies.

- 6.1.47 AG Borno wondered why so much time was spent on the NNPC report whereas it contributed nothing to the Federation Account for the month.
- 6.1.49 Ag. Chairman observed that the rise in value short fall was not in tandem with the consumption pattern and sought to know what the correct relationship was.
- 6.1.51 | AG Lagos sought to know the meaning of Strategic Holding Cost.
- 6.1.52 AG Bauchi advised NNPC to report the current liability rather than reporting negative remittance, he added that NNPC should endeavour to remit the tax and royalties due to
- 6.1.54 FIRS and NUPRC.
- 6.1.55 NNPC representative responded that, at the Plenary Session of the previous Meeting,
- 6.1.56 the Chairman was mandated to write the NNPC to find out why PPT and Royalty were
- 6.1.57 not remitted to the FIRS and NUPRC. However, in the year 2018, there was a need to
- 6.1.58 review the format with which NNPC reported revenue and the new template was
- 6.1.59 developed which got the approval of Mr. President. The new format allowed the NNPC
- 6.1.60 to utilize the revenue due to other Agencies to fund Government Priority Projects. It was
- 6.1.61 however not known to Members until NNPC started reporting negative remittance.
- 6.1.62 He educated Members that Strategic Holding Cost was the cost of holding products in
- 6.1.63 vessels on the high sea to ensure National Energy Security i.e quick access to petroleum
- 6.1.64 products to meet local demands.
- 6.1.65 Regarding the relationship between Value Short Fall and the consumption pattern, he
- 6.1.66 explained that the Value Short Fall was a function of volume and the price of import,
- 6.1.67 adding that each time the price of crude oil increased, there is a corresponding increase
- 6.1.68 in the price of imported products. He further explained that the recovery is usually low
- 6.1.69 such that when the current month's amount is added to the balance, the liability remains 6.1.70 high.
- 6.1.71 AG Kogi suggested that NNPC report be escalated to the Plenary Session and this was
- 6.1.72 | accepted unanimously. Director, HFD was to do the presentation at the Plenary Session.
- 6.1.73 NUPRC representative opined that there should be a follow up to change the Template
- 6.1.74 in favour of the stake holders since NNPC had refused to adhere to the rule.
- 6.1.75 The report was adopted upon a motion moved by the Accountant General of Delta State
- 6.1.76 and seconded by the Accountant General of Ondo State.
